Congratulations! We are pleased to announce that your grant proposal, *Research Documents for Tule Lake Segregation Center*, submitted for the Fiscal Year 2014 Japanese American Confinement Sites Grant Program has been selected for funding.

The National Park Service received a total of 36 applications, requesting over \$5.5 million Federal share, for the Fiscal Year 2014 grant cycle. The proposals reflected a wide range of project types, including oral history, interpretation and education, documentation, planning, and preservation projects. The grants were evaluated and awarded in a competitive process, and matched \$2 in federal money for every \$1 in non-federal funds and "in-kind" contributions by the grant recipients.
