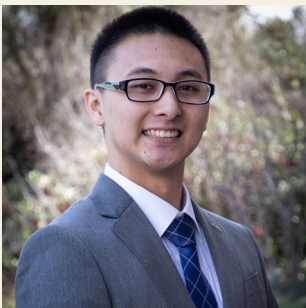
Hannah Cho
